



COVID EVENT SAFETY AND RESPONSIBILITY

ALL Attendees are required to provide the following:

- (1) Proof of full COVID-19 Vaccination** OR
- (2) Negative COVID-19 Test*** within 3 days of conference arrival. We will not accept an at-home rapid antigen test. A PCR or antigen test must be administered by a health care provider or pharmacy and results provided to conference organizers.



CONFERENCE PRESENTERS

2022 KEYNOTE SPEAKER



HEATHER LANIER

Assistant Professor of Writing Arts at Rowan University and mother to Fiona (4p-)

Heather Lanier illuminates truths about the human condition that speak to both the head and the heart. **Heather** is a poet, essayist, teacher, speaker, and thrift-store shopper. An assistant professor of creative writing at Rowan University, she is the author of the memoir, Raising a Rare Girl (Penguin Press, July 2020), along with two award-winning poetry chapbooks, The Story You Tell Yourself, and Heart-Shaped Bed in Hiroshima. She is the recipient of a Vermont Creation Grant and an Ohio Arts Council Individual Excellence Award.

Her essays and poems have been published in The Atlantic, The Sun, Salon, Brevity, Vela Magazine, and elsewhere. Her TED talk, "Good' and 'Bad' Are Incomplete Stories We Tell Ourselves," has been viewed over two million times. With an MA in Teaching from Johns Hopkins and an MFA in Creative Writing from Ohio State, she has taught Shakespeare to ninth graders in Baltimore, conversational English to housewives, ship workers, and executives in Japan, and composition and creative writing to undergraduates at places such as UC Berkeley, Miami University, and Southern Vermont College.



John Carey, MD, MPH Professor of Pediatrics University of Utah School of Medicine Salt Lake City, Utah

John C. Carey, MD, MPH, is Professor and formerly Vice Chair of Academic Affairs, Department of Pediatrics, at the University of Utah. Dr. Carey joined the faculty at University of Utah Health Sciences Center in 1979. He became Chief of the Division of Medical Genetics in 1985 and remained in that leadership position until 1999 when he stepped down to assume the role as Editor-in-Chief of the American Journal of Medical Genetics. He has held that editorial position from 2001-2016;

he is now an Associate Editor of the Journal. Dr. Carey established the Medical Genetics Fellowship Program at the University of Utah and stepped down in 2014 and continues as a mentor in the Program. Dr. Carey's research focus has been in congenital malformations, neurofibromatosis, and syndrome delineation. He has authored or co-authored over 300 papers, chapters, invited articles, and editorials for scientific journals. He co-authored the textbook, "Medical Genetics," by Jorde, Carey, & Bamshad, now in its 6th edition. The book is a widely used text in schools of medicine throughout North America and Europe.

Dr. Carey is the Co-Medical Advisor of the 4p- Support Group and followed the oldest known living patient with the condition (who passed away at the age of 71 in 2021). As a clinical scientist and geneticist focusing on chromosome syndromes, Dr. Carey has had the opportunity of chairing and helping to organize the Research Workshops on Wolf-Hirschhorn syndrome (WHS) and the 4p- Related Disorders in 2008, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017 and 2018 (sponsored by the 4p- Support Group), as well as the informal "meet and greets" between clinicians and families at the 2010 National Conference (Salt Lake City, UT). The proceedings and presentations of the 2008 meeting led to the issue in the American Journal of Medical Genetics, Part C devoted to WHS and the related disorders.

DISCUSSION CIRCLES DR. MEKEL HARRIS

Mekel Harris, Ph.D., NCSP is a practicing psychologist based in Memphis, Tennessee. She completed her pre- and post-doctoral level training at Children's Hospital Los Angeles, where she enhanced her clinical skills working with children diagnosed with an array of acute and chronic health

conditions, as well as their families. Dr Harris has presented at over 25 national international and conferences addressing child and family health issues, palliative care and grief and loss. In 2016, Harris Dr attended the 4p-



National Conference in Los Angeles where she facilitated a variety of discussion circles and met with over 90 4p- families. In 2021, Dr Harris was instrumental in creating the 4p- Support Group's first "virtual" discussion group platform which continues to serve the 4p- community today.
